Robert had a passion for life that was addictive. He lived each day to it's fullest often squeezing so many activities into a day that he had a day planner for the weekends. For him, being an Attorney was not a job, but a passion. He enjoyed helping people and righting a wrong. Bob had a passion for the law, but also for music, sailing, cooking, writing, reading, teaching, and travel.

Bob enjoyed many activities, which were an expression of his zest for life. A few of those are as follows:

- □ Sailing on the Hudson River And Becoming a member of many sailing clubs. Bob also volunteered his time for the week each summer to be part of the crew of the Clearwater, a teaching vessel, where he was often at least 45 years older than all the other crew;
- □ Recording books for the blind at the New York Institute for the Blind;
- □ Active member of the New York Press Club;
- □ Traveled to Northern Ireland at his own expense several times to assist Irish Attorneys with the Trial or Appeal of those wrongfully accused as IRA members. He would stay with the families of those imprisoned persons often cooking an Italian meal for them.
- □ He played the piano every day in his Hoboken Office. He owned several pianos and often said he would have been a musician if he could have made a living at it.
